Collecting Hair Samples for Genetic Testing

DNA is contained in the root of the hair, not in the shaft itself. It is therefore essential that the hair roots (clearly visible as bulbous protrusions) are attached to the plucked hairs submitted for DNA analysis.

Sample

Collect long, thick hairs from the switch/brush of the tail. Clean and dry, no faecal matter. Do Not send short body hair.

- 1. Select 10-20 tail hairs, wrap the hairs around your finger, and pluck with a rapid, sharp motion.
- 2. Repeat the procedure to obtain about 20-30 hairs.
- 3. The hooked or bulbous hair roots (follicles) plucked from under the skin should be clearly visible.
- 4. It is only the follicle that contains the DNA, not the hair strand.
- 5. If the samples are contaminated with mud, faeces, etc trim the distal end
- 6. Do Not tie a knot in the hair sample, place the hair onto the collection card and stick the sticker across the middle of the sample (not across the follicles)
- 7. Clearly label the sticker with the unique identity of the animal, your stud name and collection date
